Gary W. Abrams, M.D., is the David Barsky, MD Professor and Chair, Department of Ophthalmology, Wayne State University and the Director, Kresge Eye Institute in Detroit, Michigan. A native of Oklahoma, Dr. Abrams completed his residency in Ophthalmology at the Medical College of Wisconsin and his Vitreous and Retina Fellowship at the Bascom Palmer Eye Institute. Dr. Abrams has distinguished himself as a renowned researcher, clinician and teacher. He served as Principal Investigator for the Macular Photocoagulation Study, the Collaborative Ocular Melanoma Study as well as Co-Investigator for the Endophthalmitis Vitrectomy Study. He was President of both the Association for Research and Vision in Ophthalmology, 2004-2005 and the Association of University Professors in Ophthalmology, 2004-2006. Dr. Abrams has published over 160 peer-reviewed articles and authored 30 book chapters. He has been repeatedly recognized as one of the Best Doctors in America and received the American Academy of Ophthalmology Lifetime Achievement Award. Dr. Abrams' legacy is insured by the numerous residents and fellows he has trained and careers he has fostered.
